CEMEX, INC.'S MEMORANDUM
JOINING SALT RIVER PROJECT'S
MEMORANDUM REGARDING
WHETHER THE LOWER SALT
RIVER WAS NAVIGABLE IN ITS
"ORDINARY AND NATURAL
CONDITION"

Pursuant to the Commission's order at its meeting held on June 29, 2012, the Salt River Project Agricultural Improvement and Power District and Salt River Valley Water Users' Association (collectively, "SRP") has submitted a memorandum regarding whether the Lower Salt River was navigable in its "ordinary and natural condition." The SRP Memorandum evaluates the evidence submitted to the Commission during the course of this matter and evaluates that evidence both as to the Lower Salt River's "ordinary and natural condition" and as to such condition on the date of statehood. The latter is the appropriate date for consideration of title purposes. In the interest of saving the Commission's time and effort, CEMEX, by this filing, fully supports and agrees with the SRP Memorandum.

Specifically, CEMEX agrees that the evidence is clear that the Lower Salt River was NOT navigable in its "ordinary and natural condition" and that the Lower Salt River was NOT navigable on February 14, 1912. The United States Supreme Court very clearly

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1	confirmed that the test of navigability for title is pragmatic in nature asking: Was the river, as
2	of February 14, 1912, used or susceptible to being used, in its ordinary and natural condition,
3	as a highway for commerce, over which trade and travel were or could have been conducted
4	in the customary mode of trade and travel on water? (See PPL Montana LLC v. Montana, 132
5	S. Ct. 1215, 1228 (2012)). This reconfirmed the federal test of navigability for title purposes
6	that mirrors the Arizona statutory test in A.R.S. § 37-1101(5).
7	As a result, the Commission can and should find that the Lower Salt River is
8	nonnavigable.
