LION HUNTER LOST.

John McCarthy, White on a Hunting Trip in the Mogollon Mountains, Disappeared on June 7, and Parties Have Searched for Him in Valu.

Pusscorr, A. T., June 15.—J. K. Buy, a professional hunter, arrived in town to-day from Cienv crock, in the Mogollon mountains, in the eastern part of this county, and reported that his partner, John McCarthy, had been missing since June 7.

Both are experienced hunters and mountaineers and had received an order from eastern parties for specimens of Arizona wild pigeons and four dozen tassel-mared or for aquirrels, as unimal found only in the Mogollon range of mountains. They were accompanied by two other persons, and on the morning of June 7, while Day was in Flagstaff purchasing supplies, McCarthy left to go to Poverty Plat, a distance of about cirit miles, to shoot some pignons, since which time nothing has been heard of him.

His fallure to return the first evening did not cause may special alarm, but on the second day bis companions started in search of him. His tracks were found in Poverty Flat and followed into the monutains, where they were lost in pine burrs. He was going toward Baker's butte. Two days inter a party of nine cowboys joined in the search, and later another party of eow boys from the Verde valley joined them. Up to the time Day left, Jane 13, no trace of him could be found. McCarthy is a deputy United States murshal and has been fish and game commissioner of the tecritory for the past four years.
